Please find enclosed my application for the Assistant Professor of Clinical Psychology position in the Department of Psychology at Bright State University (BSU). I am currently a postdoctoral fellow in the Department of Psychiatry at the University of California San Francisco. Earlier this year, I received my Ph.D. in Psychology, with an emphasis in Clinical Psychology, from the University of Pennsylvania (UPenn). I am excited to apply to the open position at BSU. I feel it is an outstanding fit for my career goals, and I believe my work would further the missions of the Department and University.

I believe I meet both the desired and required criteria for this position. I hold a Ph.D. in Psychology from a program accredited by both the American Psychological Association (APA) and the Psychological Clinical Science Accreditation System (PCSAS). I am currently completing my postdoctoral training, such that I am on track to be licensed by July 2016. Given my training as a clinical scientist, I draw heavily from behavioral and cognitive-behavioral approaches in my work. I have a strong background and focus in Clinical Psychology. I have an active and productive program of research, with 10 publications and 7 conference presentations to date. I have experience teaching several different University courses, ranging from introductory psychology to graduate clinical practica. My classes and teaching consistently receive positive reviews. I value the opportunity to work in a diverse environment, and have spent the bulk of my professional life doing so.

My research uses multiple modes of investigation to better understand obsessive-compulsive spectrum disorders (e.g., chronic tic disorders), and to determine the most effective approaches to treating them. I would greatly look forward to collaborating with students in my research, as mentoring next-generation researchers is an important career goal of mine. I would also be excited to join in the Department's high quality teaching program. I would be prepared to teach a variety of established courses, and would also be excited to develop new offerings within my areas of expertise.

I have a great appreciation for BSU's cultural diversity. I value living and working in a diverse environment. My teaching and graduate training occurred in a diverse setting: 40% of UPenn undergraduates are first-generation college students, and over one third are people of color. In graduate school, I spearheaded my program's first-ever diversity committee. I have done extensive clinical work with youth from diverse backgrounds. I would relish the opportunity to work in the diverse environment that is BSU.
